Job Description

Salary: £22,100

Hours: 25 per week working Mon to Thurs (initially fixed term to 31/3/24 with possibility to extend)

Location: 3 days in Hertfordshire, 1 day in Bedfordshire

Background

Trauma Recovery CIC offer trauma focused therapy to victims/survivors of trauma regardless of when the experience took place.

Clients engage with the service from various backgrounds and we are able to offer time limited free as well as open ended self funded therapy.

The service works with a variety of organisations to secure funding for their service users.

In 2022 Trauma Recovery worked with an addiction agency offering short term trauma focused therapy to their service users. The results of this pilot enabled us to secure funding to expand the service. This new role is the product of the success of the pilot and enables Trauma Recovery to work collaboratively with the addiction support agency to enable clients and service users to address both addiction and trauma with a view to them increasing their life choices.

Job Summary

This role enables you to be part of an award-winning, innovative team, that brings together a creative and dynamic way of working to create a quality service for clients.

You will work 3 days per week with clients who have a history of traumatic experiences and are either actively in addiction or recently in recovery from addiction to alcohol and or drugs. 1 day per week you will work with clients who have experienced recent sexual trauma. You will offer time limited therapeutic support using the SAFE framework.

The role enables you to work in person with clients plus time working remotely completing admin tasks, attending supervision, in house CPD, case management and other meetings.

You will have excellent communication skills, knowledge of the links between trauma and addiction as well as sexual trauma.

You will have the ability to travel to agreed venues.



Main Responsibilities

- Work with adults with a presentation of both trauma and addiction offering time-limited therapy
- Work with adults who have experienced recent sexual trauma
- Commit to working within the SAFE framework for trauma-focused therapy
- Complete client notes accurately and clearly
- Work within a multi-agency service representing Trauma Recovery
- Attend clinical supervision, case management, CPD and team meetings regularly
- Work as part of a team to develop the service
- Identify ongoing client needs and safeguarding concerns
- Contribute to monitoring and feedback on the service
- Work within The National Counselling and Psychotherapy Society code of conduct and ethical guidance

General Responsibilities

- Ensure that you maintain membership in a professional counselling organisation that is also recognised by the professional standards authority (such as NCPS, BACP, UKCP)
- Maintain professional conduct at all times that supports the ethos of Trauma Recovery
- Participate as a team member, contributing to team development as well as your own professional and personal development
- Execute and assist with administrative support as needed
- Follow steps to ensure compliance with GDPR and Trauma Recovery policies and procedures
- Work closely with the project lead to develop the service
- Assist with monitoring data to develop the service

Knowledge and experience

- Qualified to at least level 4 counselling diploma level
- Your qualification must have included at least 100 placement hours
- Knowledge of trauma and addiction and the links between them
- Experience in offering time-limited therapy within a clear, focused framework
- Understanding of multi-agency working
- Professional registration with a body approved by the professional standards authority
- Commitment to deepening your knowledge and expertise around working with all victims of trauma regardless of gender and background
- An understanding of emotional and practical issues which may arise in relation to trauma

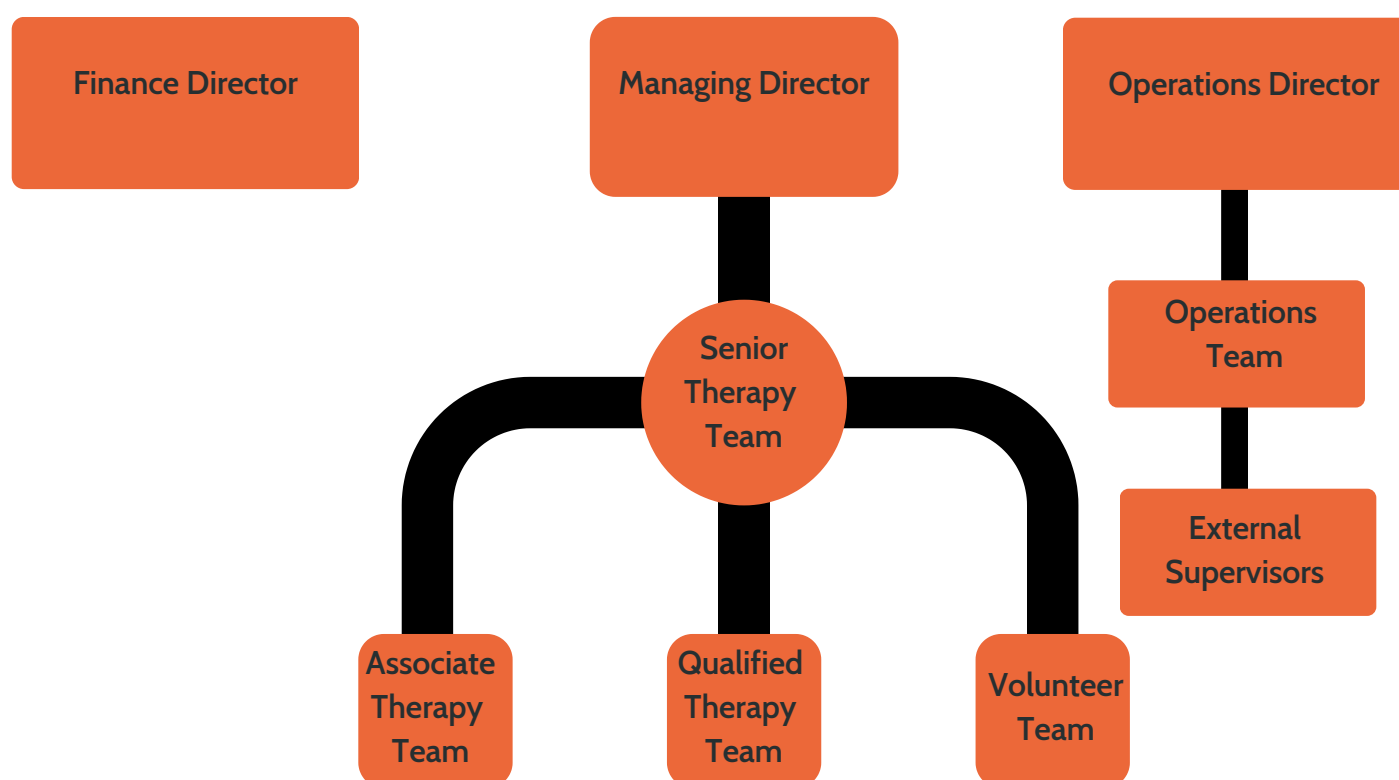
- Ability to develop good therapeutic relationships
